From the Principal's Desk

Parents, please work with the school as far as the general discipline in and outside the school is concerned. Good manners, respect and general good etiquette are crucial attributes that our children need to learn. Please work with us in imparting this to our children. Children need to respect their fellow learners and adults, whether in the classroom or while waiting outside the school. Also, parents, please take the necessary precautions as to what movies/content your child/ren watch on television, DSTV, Showmax, Netflix, etc. This has a huge impact/influence on children's behaviour. We are finding that young children are displaying inappropriate behaviour that is far beyond their age. Please ensure that you have the required controls/restrictions in place at home so that children DO NOT have access to movies that is not in accordance with the appropriate age restriction.

Parents, please ensure that you provide the school with your latest contact details. In an emergency, we must be able to get a hold of you immediately. If any of your contact details change, please notify the school immediately. Also, please ensure that you complete the inside front cover of your child's diary with all your latest information.

The HPV vaccination for Grade 5 girls will be administered by the Department of Health this Wednesday, 2 March 2022. These girls were issued with a consent form from the Department of Health two weeks ago. Children without parental consent will not receive these vaccinations. Please note further that girls who have already received their 2 injections will not be required to receive it again.

We have repeatedly made this appeal: Please note: Archibald Avenue is to be treated as a one-way street from east to west at peak times (from 07h00 to 08h00 and from 13h00 to 15h00). We have parents stopping directly in front of our car park driveway or at the scholar patrol point to offload their children, then opening the car boot so their children can retrieve their school bags. We also have parents double parked on the roadway. This is inconsiderate and causes traffic congestion. Please refrain from this – there are ample parking bays that can be utilized. Please drop off your child and leave so that other parents can utilize the parking bays as well. Please be courteous and considerate to our neighbours and the business center on Dalbini Drive – please do not block their driveways or entrances. We are appealing for the co-operation of all drivers so as not to cause undue frustration in the mornings and afternoons.
